**Two Retired military Generals discuss the New
Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty in Ohio**

“The New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty: In the context of nuclear threat reduction”
September 8-9, 2010

Washington, D.C. – **Lt. General Robert Gard Jr. (USA, ret.) and Lt. General Dirk Jameson (USAF, ret.)** will be available for interview and comment in person and by phone September 8 and 9 in Cincinnati and Columbus, respectively. They will be meeting with students and members of local organizations from the United Nations Association of Columbus, the Cincinnati and Columbus World Affairs Council, Foreign Policy Leadership Council and Central Ohioans for Peace.

Lt. General Robert Gard is currently the Chairman of the Center for Arms Control and Non-Proliferation where his policy work focuses on nuclear nonproliferation, missile defense, Iraq, Afghanistan, Iran, military policy, nuclear terrorism, and other national security issues. During his military career, Gard saw combat in both the Korea and Vietnam wars, and served a three year tour in Germany. He also served as Executive Assistant to two secretaries of defense; the first Director of Human Resources Development for the U.S. Army; Special Assistant to the Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs; and President of National Defense University (NDU). He is a graduate of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point and Harvard University.

Lt. General Dirk Jameson served as Deputy Commander in Chief and Chief of Staff of U.S. Strategic Command before retiring from the U.S. Air Force in 1996 after more than three decades of active service. Gen. Jameson was responsible for directing the headquarters staff of 4,000 men and women and participating in numerous nuclear forums with the leaders of the Russian Federation Strategic Rocket Forces. Prior to his StratCom assignment, Gen. Jameson commanded the 14,500 men and women of the U.S. 20th Air Force, and was responsible for all U.S. Intercontinental Ballistic Missiles, seven major subordinate units, operational training, testing, security and readiness. He is a graduate of the University of Puget Sound, Ohio State University, Northwestern and the National War College
